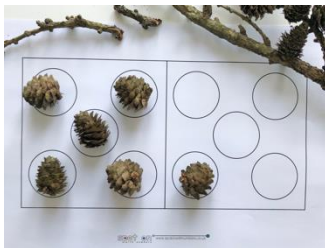

Choose a number.

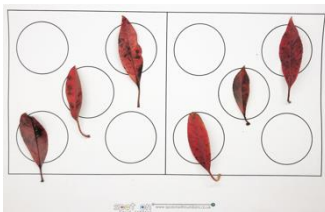
How many ways can you find to make that number?
